Kingston Forklift License - Acquiring a forklift certification or forklift license within North America would require the trainee to carry out classroom instruction in addition to hands-on training. The state, provincial and federal regulatory bodies are responsible for the certification, training and licensing for powered industrial truck operators. Operators could acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements must be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machinery that is designed along with numerous alternatives, like for example stand-up and sit down models, electric and propane versions, and various sizes and types to meet the industrial needs of employees. Operator training courses are often individualized to deal with the specific types and uses for which the operator is training. Training on a gaspowered, sit-down forklift inside a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck in a shipyard. The different forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all businesses and equipment. Regulatory standards, therefore, tend not to focus on detailed program requirements but rather on the results of individual training courses.

On the job training which is supplied by the employer is the most common form of forklift training certification and licensing. The employer who offers this method of certification is needed to provide classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers may choose to train staff on each type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The course incorporates forklift operation procedures, lift truck maintenance, safety measures and company regulations. Subject matters particular to the worksite, like dangerous conditions or materials, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely utilize and operate each and every kind of lift truck on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor normally requires an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

Usually, an employer-provided certification would not transfer from the present employer to the next employer. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a lift truck for that employer only.

The most significant factor of forklift license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one kind of machine to another. Safety issues differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both employer-provided training and third-party providers might have to deal with extra requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like in offshore and marine operations.
