Kingston Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make sure that their personnel are trained to work competently making use of telehandler machinery. The staff have to be assessed for their ability to use the machine. If deficiencies are found, employers should provide training so that staff get the needed level of skill. The responsibility level of the person has to be considered when training is provided. Effective training will remedy whichever deficiencies in the knowledge, skills and understanding of telehandler supervisors and operators. Training can be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon completing the training period would determine if the learning objectives have been met or not.

State/Provincial, local and federal rules set out guidelines for basic telehandler operator testing and training. Basic training does not deal with such topics as the lifting of suspended loads, the lifting of persons, using other attachments, or the use of rotating machines. Further training should be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Inspection and maintenance

Like whichever machinery, a telehandler requires effective maintenance. The machinery inevitably will suffer wear over time. Right maintenance is essential to ensuring safe utilization of the telehandler machinery. Inspections and checks are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators must have machine-specific training to be able to rectify, monitor and prevent problems connected with deterioration, damage and wear. Employees need experience and competence in both breakdown and periodic maintenance. The manufacturer's preventative maintenance instructions should be seriously viewed and followed, considering such factors as frequency of use and environmental conditions in the work setting.

The user of the machine along with the owner of the equipment share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is usually done by the telehandler owner whereas pre-use inspections are usually performed by the user.
